Chaplains are professionally trained spiritual care providers who journey with others with a spirit of acceptance and love.

Chaplains

- listen and offer a confidential space to speak about joys, sorrows and concerns.
- provide spiritual support during times of change or loss, respecting individual differences while affirming our common humanity.
- support residents concerning their end-of-life decisions.
- develop and coordinate community worship and memorial services.
- design ceremonies of blessing and remembrance.
- facilitate special groups, such as meditation and prayer and devotion, providing opportunities for spiritual growth and renewal.
- foster relationships with community clergy and faith leaders.
- serve as part of the multi-discipline team promoting and encouraging whole-person care and ethical decision-making.

A Diverse Spiritual Community

Havenwood Heritage Heights is a diverse spiritual community affiliated with the New Hampshire Conference of the United Church of Christ.

Spiritual Care at Havenwood Heritage Heights supports your fullness of life through the natural cycle of life's transitions. Our Spiritual Care Team engages that which gives your life meaning. This may be through one-to-one connection, hospital visitation, spirituality groups, discussions, worship and celebration. Among these are Mindful Meditation, Sunday Community Worship, Bible Sharing and Reflections in Nature. Our team also officiates weddings, house blessings and memorial services.

The department has an accredited Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) Program. CPE is a graduate level program for those training for ministry. CPE Interns are a diverse group that offer spiritual care to residents, their families and staff.

Chaplains and CPE Interns lead weekly Sunday Community Worship services held on each campus. All services are posted in the weekly newsletter calendar as well as additional services offered by area clergy.

There is a chapel on each campus. The Chapel is a place of peace and comfort where residents, friends, families and staff are welcome.

In each Chapel, there is a Spiritual Care Library with a variety of resources to borrow 24-hour's a day.

HHH encourages the development of strong bonds between residents and area churches. Bus transportation is available throughout the year.
